





Calls to Action

- 1. Establish a clear responsibility of post-secondary institutions to provide formal orientation for international students who study in Canada, including increasing awareness of legal, employment, interpersonal violence and housing rights.
- 2. Provide dedicated funding for a three-year pilot to develop a wrap-around support hub, which is centrally located and culturally-responsive to provide settlement, housing, employment and mental health supports along with human trafficking assessment and referral for international students attending post-secondary institutions.
- 3. The International Students Collaborative continue their work to better understand the impact of recent policy changes on students by developing a comprehensive Advocacy Strategy in Peel.
